Open Poultry & Pigeons

Each bird must wear a leg or wing band. Record the number and color (if applicable) on the Entry Form and Stall Card. Bands will be available on Entry day for \$1.00 each, depending on size. Each entrant will be limited to a total of 25 birds, with a maximum of 3 birds entered in any Barnyard Cross class. (A hen with chicks counts as 3 birds). Each entrant is also limited to two birds per lot per variety. When there are three or more of a breed and/or variety in a lot, they will be judged against each other. This is an officially Sanctioned American Poultry Association (APA) and American Bantam Association (ABA) show. All purebred birds (birds that meet the APA/ABA Standard of Perfection) will be judged to the latest standards.
