Special Preparations: Exhibits are limited in size to 30" wide, 30" deep, and 30" high. Collections that do not fit this area should be represented by a few samples and a photo of the entire collection. Dollhouses may exceed this size limit only if space allows. Securely fasten all furniture to dollhouses as dollhouses will be moved during judging. Do not use wax or clay as a fixative as the building can get hot enough to melt these materials. A kit is defined as a pre-cut manufactured item that has come with materials and instructions for completion. An original item is one that you have designed and put together. Parts of an original entry may be from pre-manufactured pieces, but the finished product should be unique. Handmade exhibits must be made by the exhibitor. Please include a 3 x 5 card explaining your entry.
